Collect of the day: God of grace and wisdom, who called your servant Mellitus to leave his home and proclaim your Word: grant to all who belong to the London college that bears his name diligence for study, fervour for mission, and perseverance for ministry, that they might shine with your love and truth in these dioceses and beyond, for the sake of your Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. **Amen.**
